

Our work centers on an Executive Fellowship model that places experienced professionals in local government agencies nationwide.

FUSE Executive Fellows are mid-career professionals with at least 15 years of experience.

They come from leadership roles in the private and social sectors, have strong ties to communities that their project will serve, are racially diverse (with each cohort being a majority-minority group), and are passionate about a career shift into the public sector.

During the year-long Fellowship, FUSE Executive Fellows work to align the public, private, and social sectors to remove barriers and advance solutions to pressing challenges.

Our Program Model

- Turns innovative ideas into achievable, year-long projects.
- Recruits experienced professionals from across the country to lead that work.
- Applies innovative practices from across sectors.
- Focuses on the sustainability of projects and government services.
- Provides comprehensive support, training, and learning opportunities for Fellows.

We design our coaching and learning programs to support FUSE Executive Fellows in achieving the highest potential for impact.

Convenings

FUSE Executive Fellows come together throughout the year to learn new skills that accelerate their project work, reflect upon their progress, and build community with their cohort.

Executive Coaching

FUSE provides a roster of highly skilled executive coaches for the Fellows. They support Fellows throughout the year on both personal and professional (projectrelated) development goals.

Learning Sessions

FUSE provides a robust array of learning opportunities designed to enhance Fellows' diverse needs.

Comprehensive Support

Each FUSE Executive Fellow is paired with an Alumn-in-Residence who provides ongoing support throughout the Fellowship year by helping them think through project ideas and challenges, including connecting with the larger network of partners and alumni and preparing for their calls with government hosts.
